School Uniform

Thank you to all parents and carers for ensuring your children arrive at school in school uniform. We are all very proud of our school and we are keen to continue to display this by encouraging the children to wear school uniform in line with West Lothian Council's guidelines. A reminder that the school uniform consists of grey, black or navy trousers/skirt, white polo shirt and navy sweater.

Unfortunately, over recent months, we have seen an increase in the number of children wearing skinny jeans to school which are not part of our uniform. We have gently reminded the children that this is not school uniform and with some success. However, there are still some pupils continuing to wear them. At your next opportunity please encourage your child to adhere to our uniform policy so that the whole school community looks smart and ready for the day ahead.

Footwear

A reminder to everyone - to ensure the floors are kept clean and well maintained it is important that the children change their outdoor shoes to soft indoor shoes. This is even more important now that we have new corridors, changing facilities and a Gym Hall. Please ensure that your child has appropriate indoor footwear to change into.

Clothing Bank

Please remember that we have a Clothing Bank situated just inside the inner car park for all parents to use to recycle used clothes. This continues to be a successful fund raiser for the school and profits support our ECO school initiatives. If you are using the Clothing Bank please ensure that all items of clothing are placed in a tied plastic bag before placing it in the Bank.

Lost Property

Due to the volume of unclaimed and unnamed lost property we will have to recycle these on a monthly basis to our Clothing Bank. Any named items are passed straight back to their owner. Please ensure that all items are named as this makes them easier to return.

Attendance

West Lothian Council recognises the need for all children and young people to engage fully in the education process and has developed a strategy for promoting attendance through a positive and supportive approach. This strategy provides a framework that allows early intervention, comprehensive information sharing and a positive partnership with parents/carers through a staged intervention. The West Lothian Council strategy provides a system that intervenes at an early stage. Stage 1 is where a child's absence has fallen below 90% in the previous month. A letter will be sent to inform the parent/carer that this absence is unacceptable and needs to improve. If there is no improvement, Stage 2 involves a meeting in school with parents/carers. If there is a continued drop in the absence rate Stage 3 is implemented and the school will make a referral to the Children and Young People's Team who provide programmes to address school attendance directly. If there is no improvement a Child's Planning Meeting will take place. If there is no further improvement the pupil will be referred to the Area Attendance Group with the option of referring on to The Children's Reporter.

As an employee of West Lothian Council I am required to follow this policy and monitor attendance on a monthly basis. If you have received a letter from me regarding absence and you would like to discuss this further please contact me at school.

Child Protection – Council Policy

West Lothian Council is responsible for investigating and providing help for children who have been abused, or are at risk of abuse. Social workers and police officers work together to assess and protect children and prepare an individual response to their circumstances. At Carmondean it is the responsibility of all school staff to help children to be safe and that means that if a child makes an allegation of abuse, Edinburgh and Lothian Child Protection Procedures make it very clear that action must be taken on the same day as the alleged abuse, and that the school follows procedures to alert Senior Management. As the Designated Member of Staff for Child Protection, it is my responsibility to follow procedure and that extends to contacting one of the Core Agencies, for example, teams from Health, Social Work or Police. These procedures are not taken lightly by the school and once a Core Agency is involved it remains with the Agency to make an appropriate decision. Any decision regarding a Child Protection issue is not down to the school.

As an employee of West Lothian Council I am required to follow this policy. If you require any further information regarding this please contact me at school.

Healthy Tuck Shop

Our Healthy Fruit Tuck Shop is doing really well with a good number of children buying fruit regularly. Most pupils are also bringing water to school, which is worthwhile too. Please support the school with

our tuck shop by giving your child the occasional 30p to buy a piece of fruit.

Breakfast Club

Ms Mercado, Mrs Steel and Mrs Shepherd continue to work hard to make the Breakfast Club an enjoyable experience for the children who attend. This is a free provision and runs from 8.15 where entrance to the building is guaranteed. However, some children start arriving much earlier than 8.15 when entry to the building is not guaranteed and there is no supervision. Please ensure that if your child is attending the Breakfast Club that they arrive as near to 8.15 as possible. Entry to Breakfast Club is through the P6/7 entrance.

Lunch Money

The cost of school lunch is now £2.04. If paying with cash, please ensure that your child has the correct money. This is greatly appreciated by the Pupil Support Workers who gather the monies and by Mrs McLean in the Office.

The Office Staff

As always, Mrs Wotherspoon and Mrs McLean are very busy, in particular, first thing in the morning. Please ensure that your child/children has/have everything they need for school before they enter the building. At times, many parents gather at the school office handing things in which children have forgotten and often the ladies are overwhelmed with delivering forgotten items. Money for lunches, milk, etc. should also be given to the children for payment at class collections rather than the school office. In addition, it would help if exact money is handed in to the Office as there is very little change to give out each day. Banking is done on a daily basis and so there is no availability for change to be given first thing in the morning. If you have not yet taken advantage of the online payments system that was introduced last session, then, by signing up, you will no longer have to search for the exact amount of money for lunches. iPayimpact offers you the freedom to make payments whenever and wherever you like, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week – safe in the knowledge that the technology uses the highest internet security available.
